PEMBERTON JUNIOR/MINI BALL ASSOCIATION

Mini Ball is held every Tuesday from Pre-Primary to Year 5 Students to develop their ball skills, to learn modified rules of basketball and to have fun. The sessions will run from 4.30pm to 5.30pm and will consist of 30-40 minutes learning a wide range of ball and co-ordination skills and 20 minute game at the end. The season starts on Tuesday 17th October and finishes on Tuesday 28th November with a wind-up inclusive.

VENUE: Pemberton Community Centre

UNIFORMS: White shirts and blue/black sports shorts. Bibs will be supplied each week. Coaches will keep bibs for the season. Correct Sports shoes with good grip must be worn.

SUBS: Once Subs of \$35 is paid (To be paid at commencement of Mini Ball Season) there is no additional cost to parents. There is no cover charge for players or spectators each week. We have no other income so subs must be paid to cover court hire, lights and end of year windup.

SUPERVISION: Children must be accompanied by an adult to and from the courts and are not to leave the courts until the game has finished. Children must also be accompanied by an adult to and from the toilets. Playing in the foyer area next to the courts will not be tolerated. Parents your children are your responsibility for the time they are at the Community Centre. All care is taken by no responsibility is accepted by the organisers. Coaches and umpires cannot e expected to supervise other children as well!

Parents are asked to ensure their children bring their own water bottle with them as this saves time, which is better spent on skill developing. Balls for Mini ball will be provided by the committee. Children are asked not to bring their own balls into the centre. In previous years several children have been injured while playing on the grand stand. In order to prevent further accidents we ask parents not to allow their children to play on the grandstand. Please remind players that chewing gum is prohibited in the Community Centre.
